

Airport Rail in Denver

- At a cost of \$10.50 each way, travelers can use the rail service, known as the A Line, to get from the DEN airport to Denver Union Station and vice versa on metro Denver's public transit provider. (There is a 50% discount for riders 65 and older.)
- The A Line, which opened on April 22, 2016, arrives at the recently restored Union Station, which is the city's new transportation hub. From Union Station, travelers can access additional local and regional transportation services, such as light rail, regional and local buses, Amtrak rail service, taxis, and the free 16th Street Mall shuttle (MallRide) and free downtown MetroRide buses that provides access to most downtown hotels. Union Station is about ½ mile from the Westin Denver Downtown Hotel; it is only ½ block from the 16th Street Mall shuttle stop to the hotel.
- Union Station itself is a beautiful 1914 Beaux-Arts building and the location of trendy locally owned restaurants, bars, shops and a boutique hotel.
- The new Denver airport rail has six stops along the way and takes approximately 37 minutes from the DEN station to Union Station.
